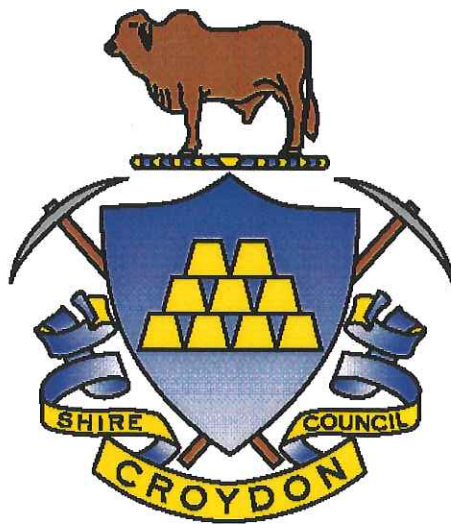

This Local Law Policy is to be read with Local Law No. 3 (Control of Nuisances).

Made by Council resolution on 24th March, 1999

1. Citation

This Local Law Policy may be cited as Local Law Policy No. 3 (Control of Nuisances).


2. Objects

(1) The objects of this Local Law Policy are to provide detailed information called upon by Local Law No.3 (Control of Nuisances) to protect the environment, and public health, safety and convenience, by eliminating or reducing nuisances resulting from:

- (a) excessive noise; and
- (b) smoke, other atmospheric pollutants, and wind-borne materials; and
- (c) light spillage; and
- (d) vegetation overgrowth; and
- (e) visual pollution resulting from unsightly accumulations of objects and materials.

3. Local Law - section 3

For the purposes of section 3 of the Local Law the following are declared to be fire hazards:

- (a) hay, straw stacks or overgrown vegetation located within fifteen (15) metres from a building;
- 

- (b) an operating chimney that has not been properly constructed or maintained in good order.

4. Local Law - section 5

For the purposes of section 5 of the Local Law the emission of noise is regulated as follows:

- (a) for residential premises the use of lawnmowers, power tools and hammers are restricted to between the hours of 7.00am to 7.00pm.
- (b) for residential construction sites the use of air compressors, concreting equipment, power tools, vibratory equipment, hammers and generators are restricted to between the hours of 7.00am to 7.00pm.

5. Local Law - section 9(1)

For the purposes of section 9(1) of the Local Law the lighting and maintaining of fires in the open is prohibited in the whole of the local government's area in the following circumstances:

- (a) the fire is lit within fifteen (15) metres of a building, power lines or flammable materials, such as hay, grass cuttings, dry wood and vegetation.
- (b) the fire is not contained in an approved incinerator, cleared area or other area approved by Fire Services.
- (c) there is not sufficient water or fire extinguishers nearby.

6. Local Law - section 22(e)

- (1) For the purposes of section 22(e) of the Local Law an application for a permit must include or be accompanied by the following:
 - (a) if the activity or state of affairs is to be ongoing the relevant dates and frequency of the proposed activity or state of affairs.
