

**CROYDON SHIRE COUNCIL
LOCAL LAW POLICY
NO. 10

(WATER RESERVES)**

This local law policy is to be read with Local Law No.10 (Water Reserves).

Made by Council resolution on

1. Citation

This local law policy may be cited as Local Law Policy No.10 (Water Reserves).

2. Objects

The objects of this local law policy are to provide detailed information called upon by Local Law No.10 (Water Reserves) to:

- (a) provide for the establishment of water reserves on land under the local government's control;
- (b) protect the quality of water supplied to the community.

3. Definitions

In this local law policy:-

"high water mark" means the high water mark of Lake Bellmore when the water in the lake is at capacity.

4. Local Law - sections 5, 6 & 7

For the purposes of sections 5, 6 and 7 of the Local Law the following watercourses and land are designated as water reserves with the following designated boundaries and assigned names:

Name of Water Reserve	Boundaries of Water Reserve
Lake Bellmore	Land 100 metres from the high water mark of the lake, except for land adjacent to L785/OL300: OL/341785 ("the occupational licence"). Where the lake is adjacent to the occupational licence the boundary will be 10 metres from the high water mark of the lake.

5. Local Law - section 9(1)

For the purposes of section 9(1) of the Local Law the following water reserves or parts of the water reserves as specified shall be available for public motor vehicle access or restricted motor vehicle access as specified:

Lake Belmore

- (1) Motor vehicles except for authorised government and local government vehicles shall have access to signed roads and carparking areas only;
- (2) Motor vehicles may only be parked in a signed carparking area.

6. Local Law - Section 9(1)

For the purposes of section 9(1) of the Local Law the specified vehicles are restricted from accessing the following water reserve:

Lake Belmore

- (a) Caravans;
- (b) Semi-trailer Trucks.

7. Local Law Section 18(3)

For the purposes of section 18(3) of the local law the local government may prescribe the following conditions:

- (a) there is a bag limit per person per day of:
 - i) 5 Barramundi
 - ii) 10 Sooty Grunter (Black Brim)
 - iii) 40 Red Claw

8. Local Law - Section 22(1)

For the purposes of section 22(1) of the Local Law the following activities are prohibited in the following water reserves:

Lake Belmore

- (a) the depositing of rubbish, garbage or any substance harmful to the health and safety of the community except in a reciprocal provided by local government;
- (b) camping;
- (c) the grazing of animals;
- (d) the bathing of animals in signed bathing areas;
- (e) discharging of a fire arm.

9. Local Law - Section 23(1)

For the purposes of section 23(1) of the Local Law:

- (a) the following activities are restricted activities in the following water reserves:
 - i) water skiing; and
 - ii) the use of motor boats.
- (b) the following restrictions are imposed on persons engaging in the following restricted activities in the following water reserves:

Water Skiing

- i) water skiing activities must be conducted between the hours of 8.00am and 7.30pm/sunset;
- ii) water skiing activities are prohibited in signed bathing areas;
- iii) water skiing activities are prohibited within 100 metres of shoreline except in areas signed to permit such activity.

Motor Boats

- i) Motor boats must not be brought within 200 metres of the outlet buoy.

10. Local Law - Section 24(1)

For the purposes of section 24(1) of the Local Law the following animals or species of animals are prohibited from being brought into a water reserve:

- (a) All animals except for:-
 - i) dogs;
 - ii) cats; and
 - iii) horses,under effective control of a person at all times.
